Mark A. Bloomfield is President and CEO of the [American Council for Capital Formation](#), a business economic policy organization. The ACCF conducts research, educates the media, and engages policymakers on a broad economic policy, including, tax, trade, infrastructure, ESG, energy, regulatory and retirement policies.

For more than four decades, Mark has been a prominent voice on current political and economic issues. CNN noted, he is “well-schooled in the arts of both economics and politics and is one of the most influential figures operating behind the scenes in Congress.” Mark has written op-eds for *The Wall Street Journal*, where he was also the subject of “[The Weekend Interview](#)”. He contributes to *Fortune* and *The Hill*, Capitol Hill’s leading newspaper.

Mark believes innovation and entrepreneurship are critical for a growing economy. He serves on the board of advisors of [Snagajob](#), the leading platform for hourly work, recently serving 5 million workers in over 300,000 locations in the US. Mark also serves on the board of advisors for [FINTECH TV](#), a global media platform covering blockchain, digital assets, and impact investing with studios at the New York Stock Exchange NASDAQ, the London Stock Exchange, and Abu Dhabi.

On Capitol Hill, Mark hosts “[Washington’s Last Salon](#),” a unique event that has received bipartisan praise—a rarity in the current political climate. These intimate dinners include gatherings of Members of Congress (including forty-one members of the current U.S. Senate), journalists, and business leaders to discuss politics and economic policy in an off-the-record, no-holds-barred setting. *The Economist* magazine noted, “Participants gather away from the cameras and grandstanding to discuss the issues of the day and on occasion help steer economic policy.”



Mark is a co-editor or contributor to six books on economic policy, including, “The U.S. Savings Challenge: Policy Options for Productivity and Growth.” He has been a Visiting Professor at Georgetown University.

As a former international long-distance runner, Mark is the world-wide “Ambassador” for the legendary Comrades Ultra Marathon (89km) in South Africa and a recipient of the “Spirit of Comrades” award. At the unveiling of the Nelson Mandela statue in Washington, D.C., he was presented with an original ballot from the first post-apartheid election in 1994 for his contribution to South Africa.

Mark received a JD from the University of Pennsylvania Law School, an MBA from the Wharton School, and graduated magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Swarthmore College.
